Karen Kissler’s “Kritter Treats” project has generated a total of \$550.00 since her team began making healthy dog treats back in October 2009. Her dog treats known as “Kritter Treats” are available at several local stores in Pacific County. The dog bones are a \$1.00 donation for six small bones. The ingredients consist of oatmeal, dry milk, oil, and bouillon. Pet owners can find the list of ingredients on the packaging as well as an expiration date. All proceeds are donated to the South Pacific County Animal Shelter through the purchasing and donating of pet food.

Recently, in a joint effort between the South Pacific County Animal Shelter and Karen Kissler’s “Kritter Treat” team, the two were able to donate a total of \$200.00 to the Oceanside Animal Clinic in Seaview. These funds are currently set aside for an animal that needs a costly surgery that is not affordable for the owner.
